Whereas, Virginia has served on the *PTDLA Journal* Working Group and on the SLA Program and Long-Range Planning committees of the Patent and Trademark Depository Library Association;

Whereas, Virginia has provided leadership to our organization through serving on the Long-Range Planning Committee between 2005 and 2009, where she served as chair for three consecutive terms from 2006 to 2009;

Whereas, Virginia was instrumental in drafting new Vision and Mission Statements for the PTDLA;

Whereas, Virginia was chosen to attend PATLIB 2007, an international patent librarians' conference in Seville, Spain, which she attended and provided a written report in May, 2007;

Whereas, while chairing the ALA/ACRL/STS Task Force on Information Literacy for Science and Technology, Virginia incorporated language on intellectual property into the “Information Literacy Standards for Science and Engineering/Technology;”

Whereas, Virginia spearheaded *Science & Technologies Libraries* 22.1-2 (2001) which focused on patents & trademarks in the United States;
